6. New Business - Review of the Audit, Risk and Compliance Committee's 2024 Work Plan

# 6. New Business – Audit, Risk and Compliance Committee 2024 Internal Audit Plan

Mr. McCoy reminded the Committee of the presentation of his 2024 Audit Universe, Risk Assessment, and Internal Audit Plan conducted at the December 5, 2023 Committee meeting, where he requested that the Committee review the proposed plan for a formal vote of acceptance at the February 27, 2024 meeting. Mr. McCoy explained that any deviations from the plan would be substantiated to the Committee throughout the year, and any items not addressed throughout the year would be rolled forward or reassessed during the next risk assessment. Upon completion of Mr. McCoy's presentation, the Audit, Risk and Compliance Committee passed a motion to formally approve and adopt the plan.

## 6. New Business – External Audit Update

The last item of new business was an update on the status of SERS' current external, independent audit of the agency's financial statements. Mr. McCoy provided the agreed upon external audit calendar as an informational item for the Committee to have as reference as the engagement progresses, disclosed that so for the agency had submitted approximately 75 items to KPMG as of February 21st, and that all non-alternative investment related confirmations had been sent independently to our investment managers by KPMG.
